Scope

- Operators of onshore hazardous liquid pipelines
- Preparing for a safe, timely, and effective response to a pipeline emergency
- Applies to U.S. Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 194 and 195
- Could voluntary be used by non-DOT jurisdictional assets





Does NOT apply to

- Post response environmental remediation
- Exploration and production operations
- Offshore hazardous liquid pipeline operations
- Facility piping
- Natural gas transmission and distribution pipeline operations


