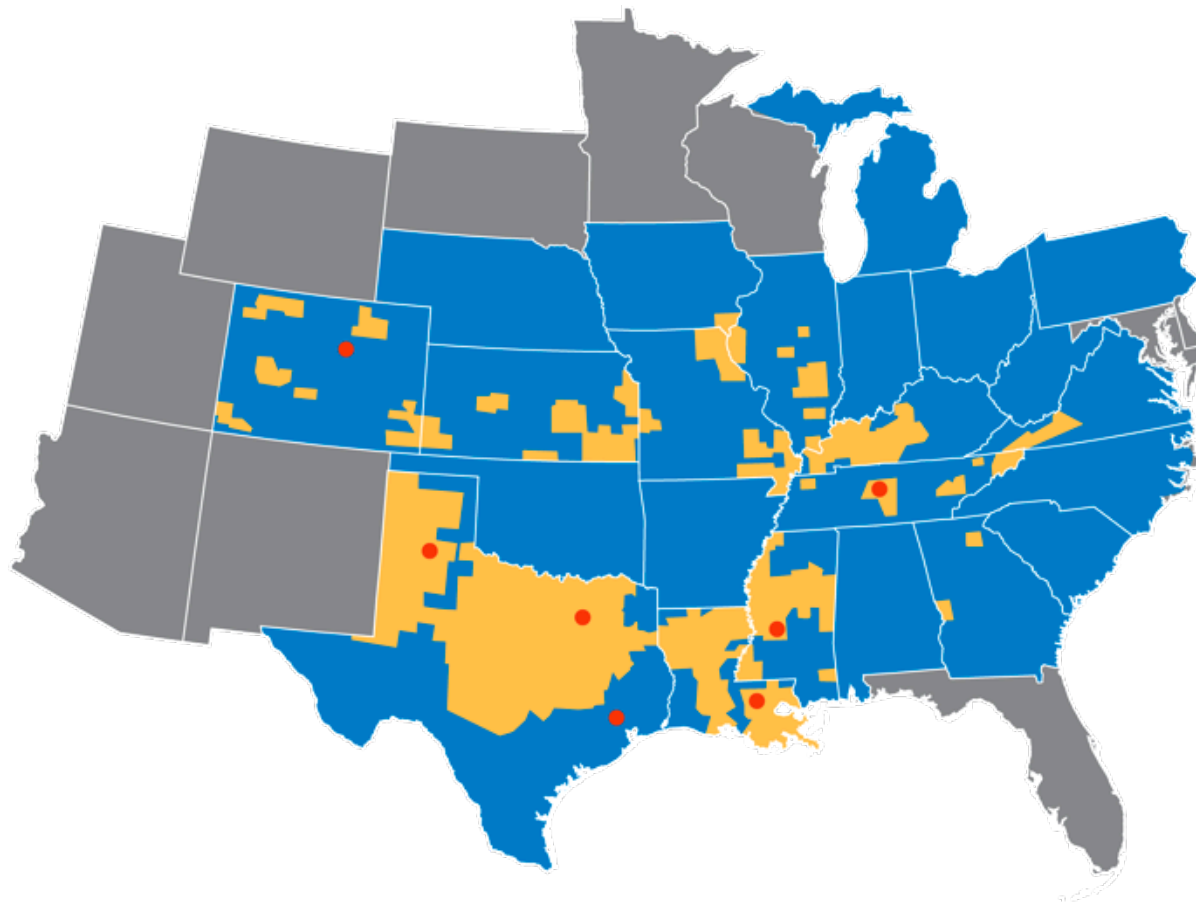

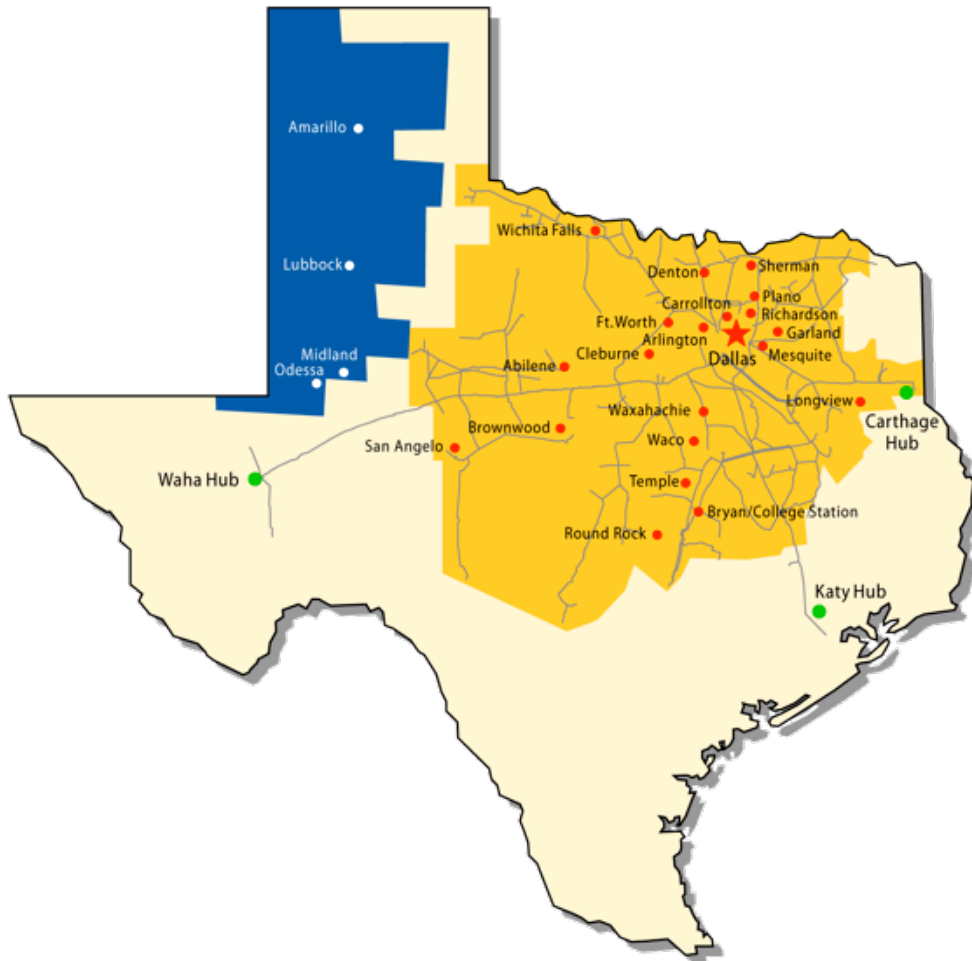
Country's second largest all-natural-gas distributor

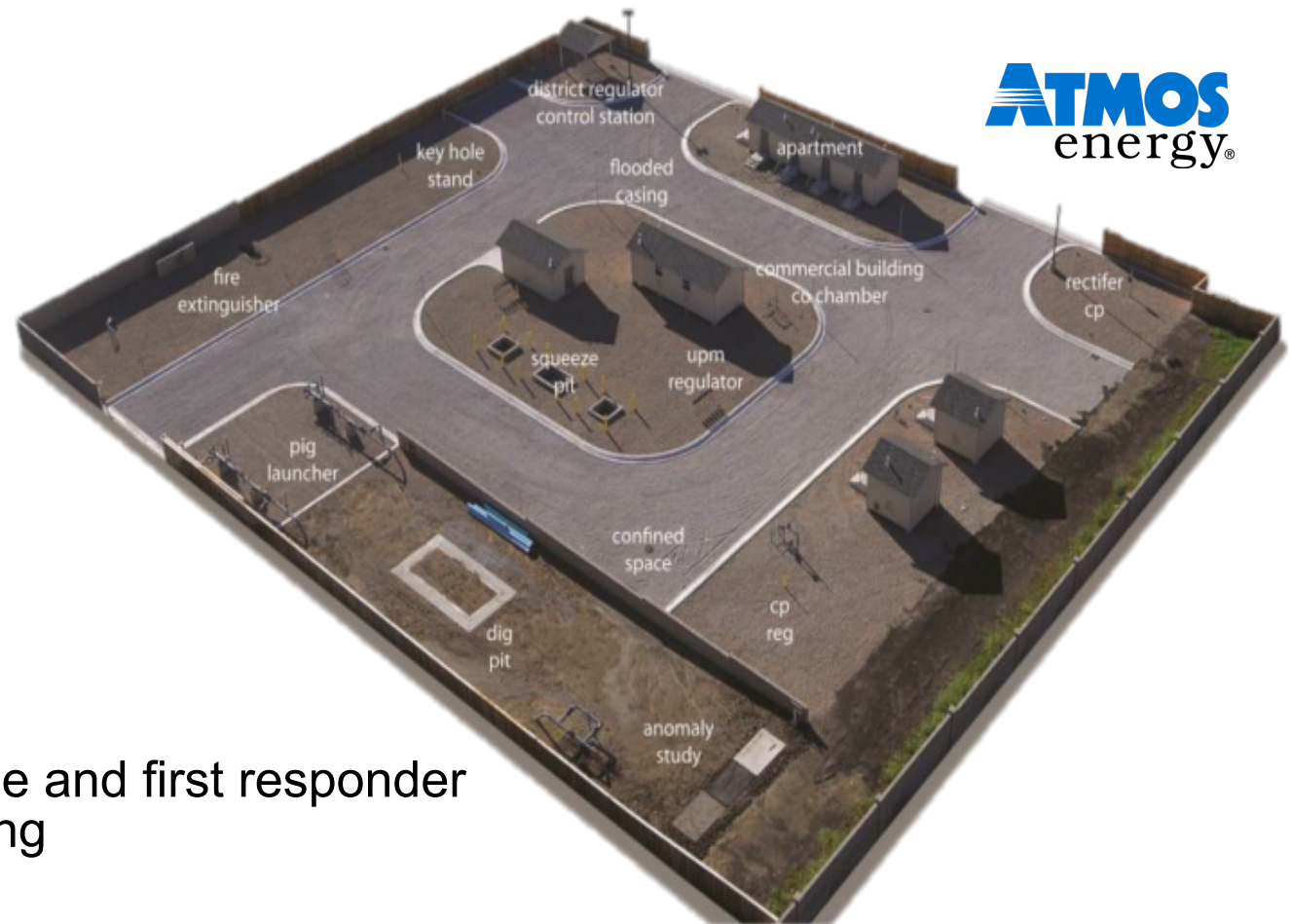
