

Where Baby Regulations Come From...





PHMSA's ability to create a new regulation comes from Congress

- Statutory Authority over a broad topic "Pipeline Safety"
- Specific Direction to implement a rule on XX



Congress may direct PHMSA to regulate an issue

OR

Congress may create a "self-executing" mandate



Safety Administration



PHMSA may initiate a new rulemaking based on:

- A Congressional directive
- To codify a self-executing Congressional mandate
- Broad safety authority to address a safety issue, update regulations, incorporate new technology or understanding, etc.
- A petition for rulemaking
- A recommendation from NTSB, NAPSR, GAO, OIG, etc.

For Significant New Rulemaking, PHMSA creates an Implementation Team of Federal/State inspectors

The Implementation Team:

- Receives specialized training on the rule.
- Helps create guidance and FAQs.
- Outreach to industry via trade association meetings/conferences.
- Develops inspection protocols for Fed/State use.
- Conducts initial compliance inspections.
- Adjusts inspection protocols based on lessons learned/input.
- Trains Fed/State inspectors.
- Weighs in on proposed enforcement.
- Hands off to Regions/States for routine, long term inspections.







All rule implementation teams are managed by a new Field Operations Division led by Rod Seeley
