"...each pipeline operator must develop and implement a written continuing public education program that follows the guidance provided in the American Petroleum Institute's (API) Recommended Practice (RP) 1162."

§ 195.440 Public Awareness (Hazardous Liquids)


API RP 1162 (1st edition, December 2003)



Public Awareness Objectives

- Promote the use of One-Call notification system prior to excavation
- Educate stakeholders about:
 - Possible hazards associated with unintended releases from pipeline facility
 - Physical indications of a pipeline release
 - Public safety measures in the event of a pipeline release
 - Procedures to reporting a pipeline release
- Understand what actions stakeholders should take to support pipeline safety

Chronology





API Recommended Practice (API RP 1162) – 1st Edition

- Provides guidance for pipeline operators:
 - Develop and implement PA programs
 - Normal operations of existing pipelines
 - Covers:
 - Intrastate and interstate H/L and natural gas transmission pipelines
 - Local distribution systems
 - Gathering systems



Regulatory Inspections


- Public awareness inspections conducted from 2010-2013
 - PHMSA (end of 2012)
 - States (by end of 2013)
- Assess operator compliance with public awareness regulations and 1st edition of API RP 1162
- Focused on:
 - Implementation efforts
 - How operator evaluated program for effectiveness
 - Continuous improvement



Regulatory Inspections

- To facilitate inspection consistency
 - Developed a Public Awareness Inspection Form and guidance
 - Trained over 200 state/federal inspectors
 - Variability in operator programs
- Created a database for inspection submissions and analysis
- Inspection results will be discussed next in panel discussions
