



### Third-Party Certification to RCMS® or RC14001® Plus Codes

#### TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION OPTIONS

#### RCMS CERTIFICATION

RC14001 CERTIFICATION

Audit HQ and sample of facilities ONCE per 3 year cycle Audit of HQ and sample of facilities, initial audit plus surveillance audits annually during 3 year cycle

Good choice if company has limited certification experience Good choice if company currently has other ISO certifications

Offers a comprehensive system with increased flexibility developed specifically for the chemical industry Starts with a broadly accepted environmental system, ISO 14001, and then integrates other Responsible Care elements.

Provides single RCMS certificate

Provides two certificates -RC14001 and ISO 14001

Will meet ACC certification requirement May meet customer certification requirements

Companies may choose a mix of RCMS/RC14001 at HQ and facilities

Companies may change certification option during next cycle


## 2013 Performance Highlight Process Safety







- State and local recognition of Security Code in lieu of regulatory requirements
- Expedited customs procedures for ACC companies under Customs-Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (C-TPAT) Program
- Alternate Security Plan (ASP) for use under Maritime Transportation Security Act (MTSA)
- Alternate Security Plan (ASP) under CFATS regulation
- Security Code approved as an antiterrorism "technology" by Department of Homeland Security under the SAFETY Act



### Process Safety Code



- Codes include practices applicable to both HQ and facilities
- Incorporates learnings from highvisibility events over the past decade such as:
  - BP Texas City
  - Deepwater Horizon
- Heavily focused on culture, systems and measurement, in a P-D-C-A format
- Addresses several "hot button" legislative/regulatory issues, including "inherently safety approaches"
